

Master's Program in Victimology and Criminal Justice (MSc)

WHAT?

The master in Victimology and Criminal Justice provides students with comprehensive scientific knowledge on victims and victimization but also on reactions toward both victims and victimization. The distinctive features of this unique master program are **innovation, interdisciplinarity** and an **international orientation**. No similar program exists in Europe or elsewhere in the world providing a comprehensive and rigorous teaching of victimology and criminal justice at the graduate level. The substance of the various courses listed in the curriculum adopts a global rather than national perspective.

FOR WHOM?

This master provides insights into victimology from the standpoint of the various academic fields feeding into the discipline namely law (national and international criminal law and human rights law), criminology, psychology, sociology, anthropology and related fields. Highly motivated students with educational background in these academic disciplines are encouraged to apply. Two introductory courses are designed to bridge the disciplinary gaps between students; depending on your undergraduate educational background.

WHERE AND BY WHOM?

The Master in Victimology and Criminal Justice is located in a very good academic environment. It is administered by the International Victimology Institute Tilburg (INTERVICT); an interdisciplinary Institute of Tilburg University and the University's first Center of Excellence. The various courses are taught by victimological experts affiliated with INTERVICT and by international renowned guest lecturers. The interdisciplinary education of the program prepares graduates for numerous employment opportunities within bodies dealing with victim issues nationally (public and private sectors) and internationally, both in research environments as in practice.
