

Visa requirements, resident permits

To enter the Netherlands, all non-EU/EEA citizens (except for those from Australia, Canada, Japan, Monaco, New Zealand, South Korea, and the United States of America) will require a single-entry visa ('Machtiging voor Voorlopig Verblijf').

The countries of the EU/EEA are:

Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Cyprus, the Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxemburg, Malta, Norway, the Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Sweden, and the United Kingdom.

All other nationalities will be required to apply for a residence permit.

If you are obliged to apply for a residence permit, you will need to include the following documents with your application:

- Passport photo
- Copy of passport
- Proof of granted fellowship at Tilburg University
- Proof of financial support for the duration of your stay (if applicable)
- Tuberculosis declaration (if applicable)

All documents provided must be in English, French, German or Dutch. If they are not, you must get an authorised translation of the document. This can often be done through the Dutch Embassy or Consulate nearest to you.

The institute/university will assist in applying for a visa and residence permit for those not coming from one of the countries mentioned above and staying for a period **longer than 3 months**. In case you need a visa and are staying **shorter than 3 months** you'll have to apply for a visa yourself via the Dutch Embassy (or representation) in your country.
