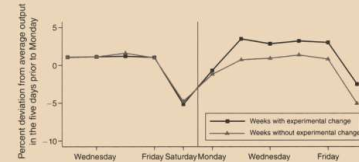
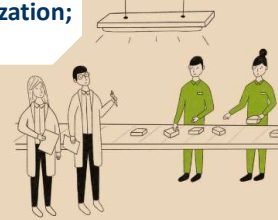


Major-Minor in Social Psychology

Introduction

As a social psychologist, you study how the thoughts, feelings, and behaviors of people are influenced by the presence of others. You will develop an understanding of the determinants of social behavior at various levels of societal organization; countries, cultures, communities, companies, and other collectives.



Courses Social Psychology

Evolutionary Psychology

Block 2

6 ECTS

In this course, you study issues like aggression, morality, environmental problems, and social inequality through the lens of evolutionary psychology. Working forms are on-campus tutorials and online practicals.

Social Cognition

Block 4

In this course you learn how cognitive processes (e.g., perception, memory) shape our understanding of social issues. From this perspective, we will discuss topics like misinformation, elections, marketing, and philanthropy.

6 ECTS




6 ECTS – Only Major

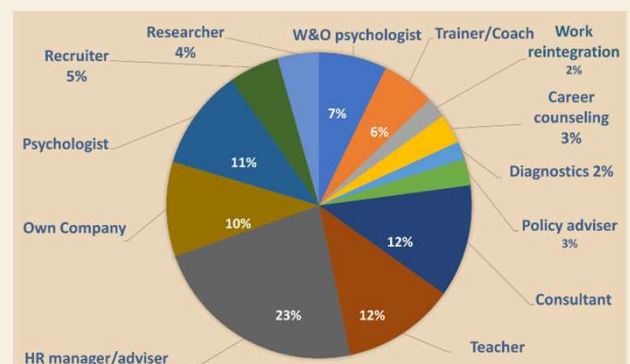
