

## General Terms and Conditions Voucher Courses Language Center

### 1. Definition and granting of language vouchers

- 1.1 A language voucher is a digital credit for following a language course at the Language Center worth 1 ECTS credit<sup>1</sup>.
- 1.2 Full-time students, part-time students, pre-Master's students, and dual students who pay tuition at TiU (or at JADS) receive 12 language vouchers at enrollment that they can spend during the entire period of their enrollment.
- 1.3 Exchange students also receive 12 ECTS credits in language vouchers.
- 1.4 Language vouchers are personal and not transferable, exchangeable, or tradable.
- 1.5 There are certain conditions attached to the granting and use of these language vouchers, which are explained in the text below. Students using the language vouchers certify that they meet these conditions.

### 2. Courses

- 2.1 Language vouchers are for Language Center language instruction that is *not a* required part of a curriculum.
- 2.2 Students may be allowed to take the language courses as part of their free electives. Information on securing permission to do so can be obtained from the School.
- 2.3 If the language course cannot be included in the free elective, the course will be listed on the grade list as an additional course upon completion.

### 3. Voucher credit

- 3.1 Voucher credit can be accessed through Osiris Student.
- 3.2 As long as the student is enrolled at TiU, he or she can use the language vouchers.
- 3.3 The registration for a course with language vouchers is only valid if the student is officially registered at Tilburg University during (at least) the first 2 weeks of classes of this course.
- 3.4 The credit of students who unenroll, or fail to enroll for a subsequent academic year, will be frozen. If a student subsequently re-enrolls, their credit will be reactivated.
- 3.5 If the voucher credit is insufficient, students may participate in Language Center courses at a reduced rate.
