

Library and IT Services – Manual EndNote import filters Tilburg University

The listing below indicates per database how you can export references from the database to import them in EndNote. Follow these steps for the best results. If you notice an error, please send an email to lis-servicedeks@tilburguniversity.edu

Annual Reviews

Mark the titles you want to download

At *Select* Option choose *Download citation*

On the next screen, choose *EndNote* under *Download to citation manager*

Make sure to check *Enable quick import*

Click *Download Chapter Metadata*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

ATLA Religion database + Atlas (EBSCOhost interface)

Select the title you want to download

Select *Export*

Select *Direct Export* in *RIS Format* (e.g. CITAVI, EasyBib, EndNote, ProCite, Reference Manager, Zotero)

Click *Save*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

Brabant-Database

From the titles' list: click under *Records* on *Export* (max. 100) to export all results, or click a title and then choose *Record export* to export a single title.

Choose *RIS format*

Choose *save file*

Choose *Export*

Give location and name

Use in EndNote the option *File - Import* and the filter *Reference Manager (RIS)*

Catholic Periodical and Literature Index (EBSCOhost interface)(EBSCOhost interface)

Select the title you want to download

Select *Export*

Select *Direct Export* in *RIS Format* (e.g. CITAVI, EasyBib, EndNote, ProCite, Reference Manager, Zotero)

Click *Save*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

EconLit (EBSCOhost interface)

Select the title you want to download

Select *Export*

Select *Direct Export* in *RIS Format* (e.g. CITAVI, EasyBib, EndNote, ProCite, Reference Manager, Zotero)

Click *Save*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

ERIC (ProQuest interface)

Mark the titles you want to download

Choose *More*

Choose *Export/Save – RIS (works with EndNote, Citavi, etc.)*

Select *Continue*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the title in

Google Science (Scholar)

Go to *Settings*

Select under *Bibliography manager*, " *Show links to import citations into [EndNote]*"

Save preferences

A link *Import into EndNote* appears with each result

NB: above steps are once-only per browser, as your preferences are filed.

Choose *Import into EndNote* at a title

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the title in

GreenFILE

Select the title you want to download

Select *Export*

Select Direct Export in RIS Format (e.g. CITAVI, EasyBib, EndNote, ProCite, Reference Manager, Zotero)

Click *Save*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

IEEE Computer Society Digital Library

Select the title you want to download

Choose *Citation*

Select *EndNote*

A new window opens with the bibliographical information

Save the page as a text file

Open EndNote

Go to *File – Import – File*

Browse to the location of the file you saved

Choose *Import Filter Reference Manager (RIS)*

Click *Import*

The record will be added to your library

IngentaConnect

Select the title you want to download

Choose *Export options - EndNote*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

JSTOR (JSTOR interface)

Mark the titles you want to download

Choose *Citation Tools - Export Citation*

Choose *RIS file (EndNote, ProCite, Reference Manager)*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the database

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

LexisNexis: Newspapers & Wires

Mark the titles you want to download

Choose *Export Bibliographic References*

Choose *Download Bibliographic Information*

Click *Export*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

Library, Information Science & Technology Abstracts

Select the title you want to download

Select *Export*

Select Direct Export in RIS Format (e.g. CITAVI, EasyBib, EndNote, ProCite, Reference Manager, Zotero)

Click *Save*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

Linguistics and Language Behavior Abstracts (ProQuest interface)

Mark the titles you want to download

Choose More

Choose Export/Save – *RIS (works with EndNote, Citavi, etc.)*

Select Continue

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the title in

MEDLINE

Select the title you want to download

Select *Export*

Select Direct Export in RIS Format (e.g. CITAVI, EasyBib, EndNote, ProCite, Reference Manager, Zotero)

Click *Save*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

MUSE

Save the citation(s) you want to export

Choose *Export Saved Citations*

Select *Export to EndNote*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

MyiLibrary

Open the book for which you want to export the citation

Select *Bibliographic Details*

Select *Export to EndNote*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

NARCIS

Select *Save publication*

Select *Save as EndNote*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

OAPEN (Open Access Publishing in European Networks)

Select the title you want to download

Choose *Export Citation*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the title in

Oxford Islamic Studies Online

Select *Cite* (pencil icon)

Under *Download to Citation Management Software* select *EndNote*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the title in

Oxford Journals

Mark the titles you want to download

Choose *Download to citation manager*

Choose *Go*

Choose *Download ALL Selected Citations to Citation Manager*

Choose *EndNote*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the database

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import titles in

Oxford Scholarship Online

Click *Cite* (pencil icon)
Select *Export RIS File*
Save the file
Open EndNote
Go to *File – Import – File*
Browse to the location of the file you saved
Choose *Import Filter Reference Manager (RIS)*
Click *Import*
The record will be added to your library

Past Masters

Select *Export A Citation*
Select export format *EndNote*
Click *Export Citation*
Go to *File – Import – File*
Browse to the location of the file you saved
Choose *Import Filter EndNote Import*
Click *Import*
The record will be added to your library

Philosopher's Index (EBSCOhost interface)

Select the title you want to download
Select *Export*
Select *Direct Export in RIS Format* (e.g. CITAVI, EasyBib, EndNote, ProCite, Reference Manager, Zotero)
Click *Save*
Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file
EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

PhilPapers

Select *Export citation*
Select *EndNote*
Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file
EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the title in

ProQuest

Mark the titles you want to download
Choose *More*
Choose *Export/Save – RIS (works with EndNote, Citavi, etc.)*
Select *Continue*
Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file
EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the title in

PsycInfo (EBSCOhost interface)

Select the title you want to download
Select *Export*
Select *Direct Export in RIS Format* (e.g. CITAVI, EasyBib, EndNote, ProCite, Reference Manager, Zotero)
Click *Save*
Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file
EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

PubMed (PubMed interface)

Possibly mark the titles you want to save
Choose at *Send to* the option *Citation Manager*
Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file
EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the title in

SAGE Journals Online

Possibly mark the titles you want to file

Choose *ADD citations*

Choose *Save/Print/ Email/Download*

Choose *Download to Citation Manager*

Choose *EndNote*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

Science Direct

Possibly mark the titles you want to file

Choose *Export*

Choose *RIS (for EndNote, Reference Manager, ProCite)*

Choose *Export*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

Social Services Abstracts (ProQuest interface)

Mark the titles you want to download

Choose *More*

Choose *Export/Save – RIS (works with EndNote, Citavi, etc.)*

Select *Continue*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the title in

Sociological Abstracts (ProQuest interface)

Mark the titles you want to download

Choose *More*

Choose *Export/Save – RIS (works with EndNote, Citavi, etc.)*

Select *Continue*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the title in

SpringerLink

Select the title you want to download

Choose *Export citation*

Choose *EndNote (RIS) at Select Download*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

SSRN (NB: you will have to sign up for a (free) SSRN & CiteULike account before you can export citations.)

Select the title you want to download

Select *ShareSelect CiteULike*

Your citation is saved to CiteULike and you can export it from there

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

Taylor & Francis Online

Mark the titles you want to download

Select *Choose an action – Download Citation*

Select *RIS (ProCite, Reference Manager)*

Choose *Open* in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file

EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

Tilburg University Research Portal

Exporting references is not possible, but for some articles a workaround exists. This requires the publication to have a DOI listed in the portal:

Copy the value of the DOI

Create a new reference in EndNote and paste the DOI in the *DOI* field

Save the reference

Use the EndNote option (right mouse click) *Find Reference Updates*
Update all fields with the information found

Times Digital Archive 1785-1985

Mark the titles you want to download

Go to *Marked Items*

Click the envelope/e-mail icon

Fill in your email address at *Mail to*

Select *Plain text* as E-mail format

Click *Send*

Now you receive the references via email

Save the email as .txt file

Use in EndNote the option File - Import and the filter InfoTrac (Gale)

Web of Science

Possibly mark the titles you want to download

Choose *Save to EndNote Desktop* (instead of Save to EndNote Online)

Choose *Send*

Choose Open in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file
EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

Wiley Online Library

On the article page, select *Export Citation for this Article*

Select *Format* EndNote

Click *Submit*

Choose Open in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file
EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

WorldCat Discovery

Click the title you want to download

Click the *Sharing and permalink options* button



Select *Cite record*

Select *Cite with EndNote*

Choose Open in case you are asked whether you want to open or save the file
EndNote starts and you can choose a library to import the titles in

To export multiple titles, add them to a list first.

Beware: if a publication has multiple authors, you have to manually fix the author field after importing
