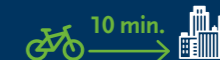

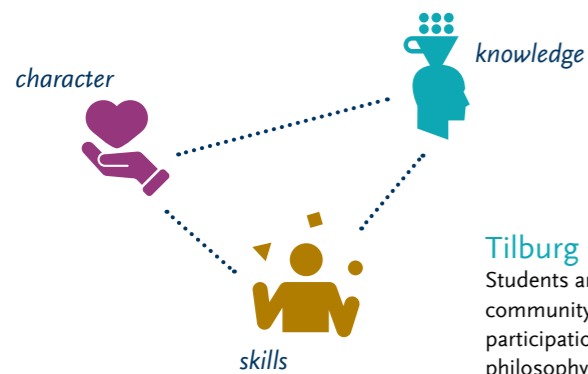

3 Live in one of the safest, happiest, and healthiest countries

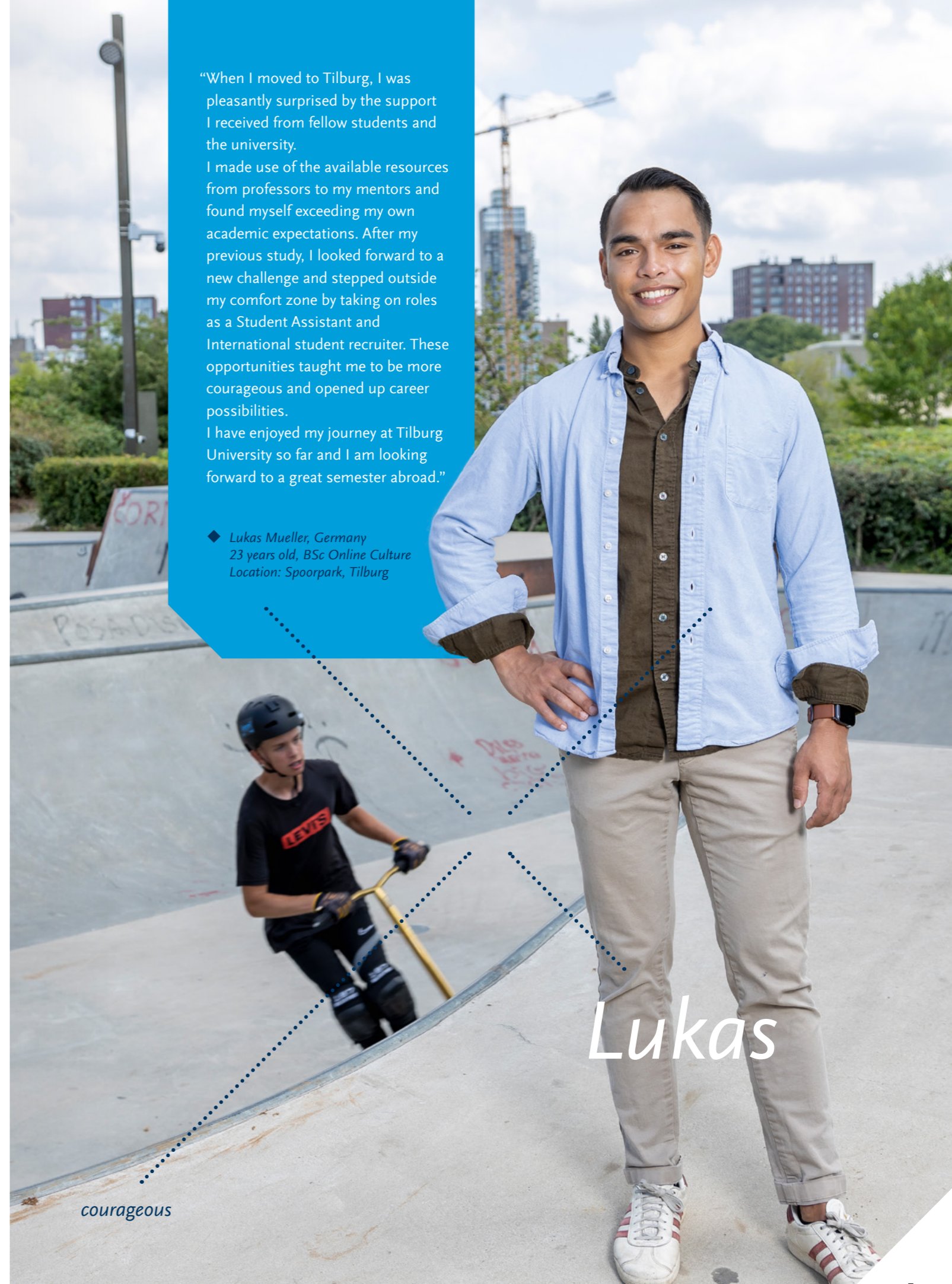

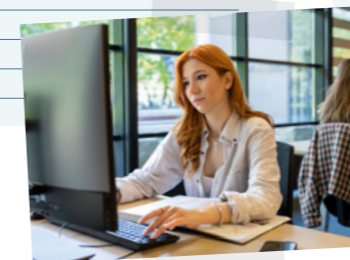

Challenge yourself, extend your degree!

In many of our programs in the areas of social and behavioral sciences, economics and business, and communication, culture and philosophy, you have the opportunity to challenge yourself by doing a double or multiple degree program and studying abroad at one of our partner universities around the world. If you want to build your professional skills, you can do an Extended Master's program, or a QTEM program, during which you do a traineeship at one of our partner organizations in the Netherlands or abroad. Good to Know

Costs

Besides tuition fees, you will need to cover living costs and personal expenses. Life in Tilburg is relatively affordable compared to other Dutch cities, such as Amsterdam and Utrecht. Student budgeting will vary per individual - you may end up spending more or less than the estimate. The approximate cost of living in Tilburg is between **€ 925 and € 1,125 per month**

EEA/EU students

If you hold a EU or European Economic Area passport, you are entitled to a reduced tuition fee rate. You also have the opportunity to apply for a Dutch government loan to cover your tuition fees. If you meet the conditions, you may also apply for a loan to cover living costs, free public transportation, and a supplementary grant from the Dutch government.

Working while studying

International students are allowed to engage in paid employment alongside their studies. If you are from the EU/EEA or Switzerland you are free to work without restrictions. If you are not from the EU/EEA or Switzerland, you can only do this for a limited number of hours per week and only if the employer has applied for a work permit for you. Consider that you can either work for a maximum of 16 hours a week during the year, or full-time during the months of June, July, and August.

Accommodation

Tilburg is a popular student city in the Netherlands and demand for student housing is high. Though Tilburg University does not own accommodation, we work with a number of preferred suppliers for housing who offer fully furnished rooms and apartments specifically for international students. Please note that we cannot guarantee student housing. It is your own responsibility to find accommodation once you are admitted, and we advise you make it your main priority before arriving in the Netherlands.

 We recommend you start searching for a room several months before your studies start. You can find more information, tips and contact information of the Housing Office on our website.

Application and Admission

Bachelor's programs Diploma requirements

Tilburg University accepts a range of secondary school diplomas from all over the world. For instance, we accept the International or European Baccalaureate (IB /EB) and European secondary school diplomas that would enable access to university in your own country, such as the German Abitur, the Swiss Matura, the French Baccalauréat, or British A-levels. For an overview of generally accepted diplomas, please check our website.

If your secondary school diploma does not precisely meet the requirements of the program of your choice, you may be required to complete an additional year at a different university before you can start at Tilburg University.

English language proficiency*

You need to demonstrate your proficiency in English by submitting the results of either:

- Academic IELTS: 6.0 (5.5 min. for all parts)
- TOEFL iBT: 80
- Cambridge:
 - C1 advanced: score A, B or C
 - C2 proficiency: score A, B or C
- By submitting your IB or EB diploma

Different requirements apply for:

- LLB Global Law:
Academic IELTS - min 6.0 for all parts.
- BSc Data Science:
Check the website for the latest information.

** Please note that exemptions are possible. To find out whether you may be exempted, refer to the admission & application page of your preferred program.*

Additional requirements

Additional entry requirements may apply, depending on the program you are interested in. For example, you need to have sufficient knowledge of mathematics to enroll for certain programs. For most of our programs, you will need to take part in an application procedure, which involves writing a motivation letter, and sometimes taking part in an interview or writing an essay.

Master's programs Diploma requirements

In general, you are eligible for a Tilburg University Master's program if you have a degree equivalent to a Bachelor's degree from a Dutch research university in a relevant discipline for the program of your choice. Our Admission Committee will assess your application and decide whether you are eligible for admission.

Pre-Master's programs

If your Bachelor's degree does not entirely meet the requirements of the program of your choice, you might be eligible for a pre-Master's program. A pre-Master's program is designed to fill knowledge gaps and provide you with the foundation required to pursue the Master's of your choice. After you have completed the pre-Master's program, you will be able to start your Master's program at the next available intake.

English language proficiency*

You need to demonstrate your proficiency in English by submitting the results of either:

- Academic IELTS: 6.5 (6.0 min. for all parts)
- TOEFL iBT: 90 (22 min. for all parts if you are applying for a (pre-) Master's program in the field of Economics & Management)
- Cambridge
 - C1 advanced: score A, B or C
 - C2 proficiency: score A, B or C

Different requirements apply for:

- Research Master's programs:
Academic IELTS - min 7.0 (6.5 min. for all parts) /
TOEFL iBT - min. 100.

** Please note that exemptions are possible. To find out whether you may be exempted, refer to the admission & application page of your preferred program.*

Additional requirements

Programs in the field of **Economics** require a GRE with a minimum score of 160 on the quantitative part.

Programs in the field of **Business** require a GMAT with a minimum overall score of 550. International Management requires a minimum overall score of 600.

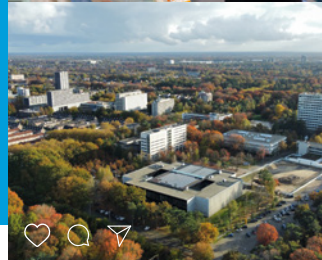
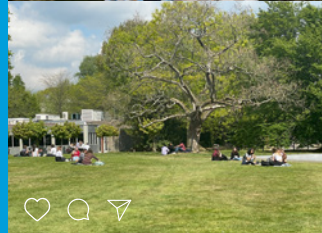
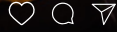
