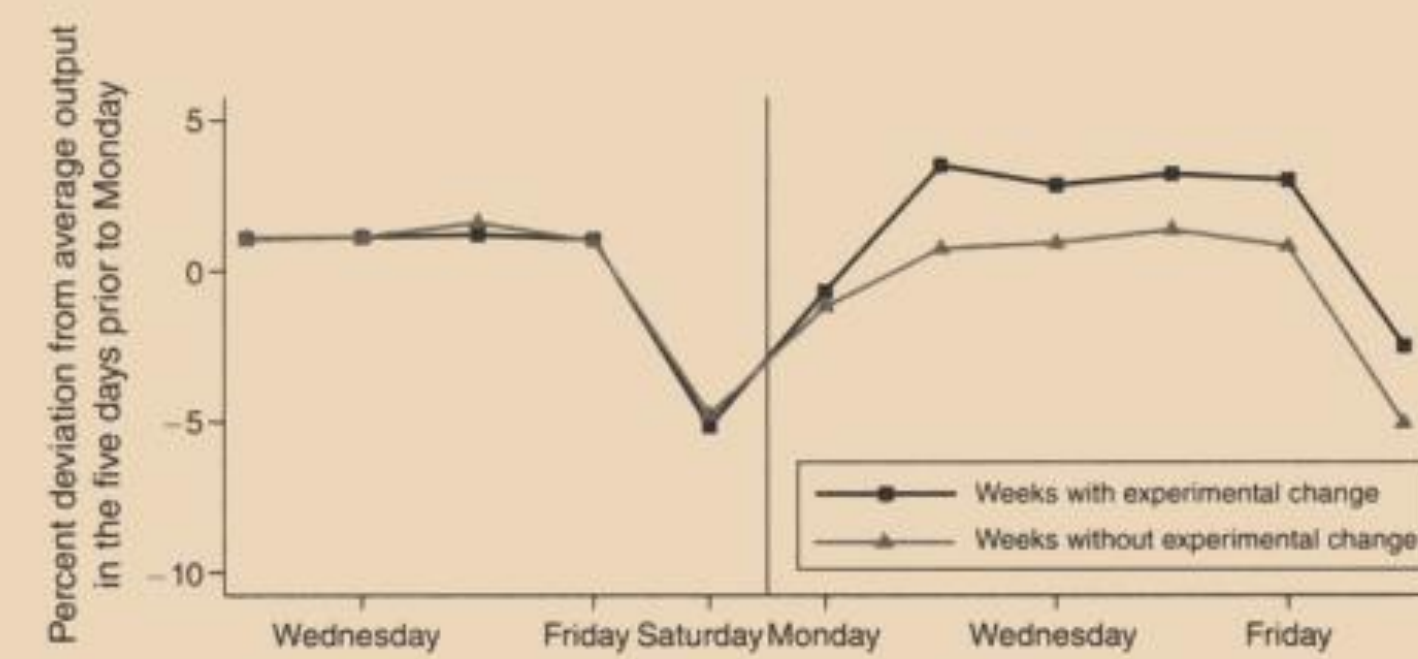
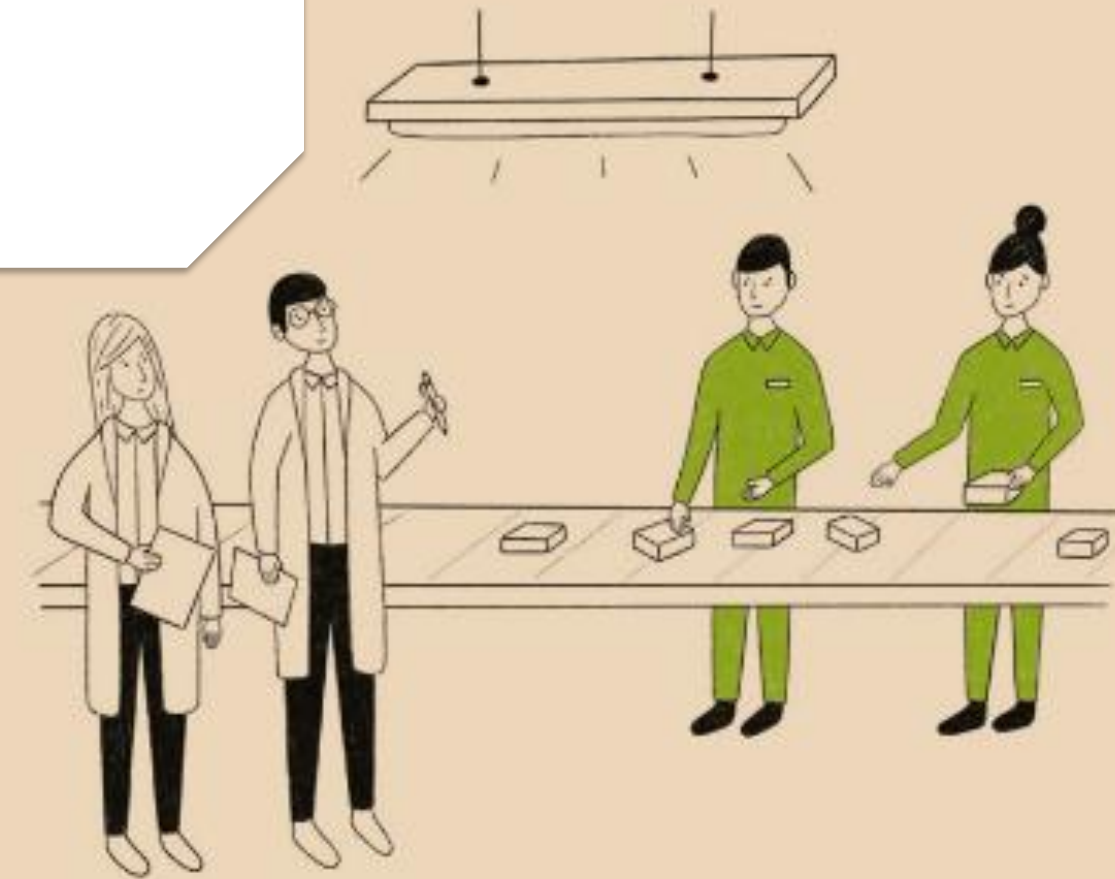


Major-Minor in Forensic Psychology

Introduction: This major-minor focuses on answering questions like: Why do people show violent/sexual deviant behavior? How do people become the way they are, and what can we do about this?



Courses Forensic Psychology

Introduction to Forensic Psychology

Block 2

6 ECTS

In this course you learn what the role of psychology is in the justice system, how we can explain delinquent behaviour, how we can distinguish different offenders and how we can predict recidivism.

Risk Assessment

Block 3

6 ECTS

This course provides an introduction to risk assessment: the process used to assess future criminal behaviour. It discusses different types of risk and protective factors and instruments used to assess recidivism.

Criminality, Cognition and Personality

Block 4

6 ECTS

This course takes a closer look at the role of personality/individual differences in the explanation of antisocial and violent behaviour. It further examines the aspects that are related to an increased risk of crime.

Block 1
