
Major-Minor in Social Psychology


As a social psychologist, you study how the thoughts, feelings, and behaviors of people are influenced by the presence of others. You will develop a clear understanding of determinants of social behavior at various levels of societal organization; countries, cultures, communities, companies, and other collectives.

Example Topics

- How do we form and change attitudes?
- Why do we rely on stereotypes when judging others?
- When do we conform to group norms (even against our own beliefs)?

Courses Social Psychology

Block 1

Applied Social Psychology - 6 ECTS (only Major!): This course provides you with the theoretical and practical tools to analyze a real-life societal problem and propose initial strategies to address it. Working forms are lectures (including guest lectures) and workgroup sessions.

Block 2

Evolutionary Psychology – **6 ECTS:** In this course, you will learn to perceive societal issues through the lens of evolutionary psychology. This course provides new perspectives about the causes of aggression, morality, environmental problems, sexism, racism, and social inequality in general. The course consists of online content, class discussions, and a practical series.

Block 3

Group Dynamics – **6 ECTS:** This course is designed to offer you a thorough understanding of the theories and scientific research on group dynamics and develop an understanding of why and how humans form groups and when group identities cause collaboration and conflict in society. The course consists of lectures and workgroups.

Block 4

Social Cognition – 6 ECTS: In this course you will learn about social cognition – the part of psychology that deals with how individuals understand and make sense of others within their social world. The course consists of online knowledge clips and Lectures.
